## **Sample Course Description**

Course Title: Archeology and History of Art

**Course Credits: 7** 

Language of Instruction: Albanian/English

Course Description: The objective of the course is to allow students to have knowledge on the basis of archaeological methodology, from diagnostic techniques to excavation techniques and the results of communication and musealization, and to understand the nature of archaeological sites and the valorization of their problems as well as their promotion. Also, this course aims to acquaint students with the history of art in the world from Antiquity to our days, as well as with the history of art in our country in different historical periods. This helps students to know how to appreciate the evolution of art and its features, as well as the importance of its correct interpretation, valorization, and promotion of works of art for tourism as well.

**Course Goals**: This course seeks to help students to know how to appreciate the evolution of art, artifacts and their features, as well as the importance of its correct interpretation, valorization, and promotion of works of art, artifacts and archeology sites for tourism as well.

Course Requirements: The main course requirements are participation in the classes and in different expeditions. The students need to participate at 75% of the course hours of the seminars. Students also have an important role in the seminars to how active they have been during the year with listening and reading. The course terminates with a final exam that has the biggest score but also in participation in the classes and in expeditions will be included there.
