Course Title: Introduction to linguistics

Course Credits: 6

Language of Instruction: French

Course Description:

This course aims to:

- To familiarize the student with the history of the development of linguistic thought, with the basic notions of general linguistics and to prepare him to undertake the study of other linguistic subjects without difficulty.
- -To equip the student with theoretical knowledge on the origin of the language, its nature, its function, the linguistic structures, the linguistic symbols, its relation with the speakers and the culture, the linguistic communication, the classification of the languages.
- -Through practical exercises, the linguistic awakening of students aims to understand the functioning of the French language by discovering various aspects in phonetics, lexicology, grammar, stylistics.

Course Goals:

At the end of this course, the students will be able to better use the constituent elements of the language and its use, to correctly apply the diagram and the elements of communication. This course will help them to use a precise language to approach after other disciplines in the curriculum.

Thanks to the exercises that accompany certain issues, students will be able to understand the basic concepts while encouraging reasoning by offering methodological advice.

Most of the examples are taken from the French language to help them better understand how this language works in various aspects such as phonetics, lexicology, morphology, syntax, stylistics.

With the knowledge acquired in this area, the student will be able to make a typological distinction between the languages he speaks, including his mother tongue.
