Course Description:

SPSS (Statistical Package for the Social Sciences) is a tool for statistical analysis of data. This allows performing a wide range of procedural statistics.

The main is to provide knowledge of the program to be able to be used in a socio-economic context and in the data of a field of research.

Good knowledge of basic descriptive statistics. It is advisable to have a good familiarity with PC operations and a working knowledge of spreadsheet application software (Excel).

Course Requirements: Regular attendance of lectures and seminars by all students is essential for the acquisition of theoretical material and for facilitating classroom discussions. The obligation and measure (%) of attending seminars and lectures is defined in the Regulations of the University of Shkodra for the second cycle of studies. Attendance will be monitored continuously.

The student is evaluated for his work according to a scoring system of 0-100 points. Student evaluation will be carried out as follows:

- Activation during the course or seminars (10 points). groups or individual exercises using SPSS, preparatory group work in class, explained chapter exercises and early homework.
- > Course assignment (10 points). Example using SPSS analysis.
- Final exam (80 points), which will include multiple choice questions, statements, descriptive questions, creative and examples of case situations related to the concepts covered during the lectures and seminars.

Grading: Grade 10 (96-100 points); Grade 9 (86-95 points); Grade 8 (76-85 points); Grade 7 (66-75 points); Grade 6 (56-65 points); Grade 5 (45-55 points); Grade 4 (less than 45 points).

Course Schedule: This course takes place in the first and second semester, with weekly academic workload 2/1 (two hours lections, one hour seminar). Lecture attendane is not mandatory. Seminar attendance is mandatory in 75% of hours.
