Language of Instruction: Albanian

Course Description: In the Syntax (II) lecture course, students will be equipped with the necessary and contemporary theoretical knowledge about the syntactic structure of the Albanian language and about some trends in its development. Basic data will be given for many controversial problems related to the phrases: types, schemes, etc. The simple sentence and phrase. Understanding the predicate units that make up the phrase. Means of connection and intonation. Compound sentences. Complex sentences. Compound-complex sentences. The different types of schemes in the phrases of the Albanian language. Classification of the phrases with subordination. Adverbial Clauses. Phrase with coordinated sentences. Phrases with dependent subject clause. Phrases with dependent adverbial clauses. Phrase with dependent predicative clauses. Phrases with definite dependent clauses. Phrases with circumstantial subordinate clauses. Place Clauses, Time Clauses. Manner Clauses (and condition): cause, reason, purpose, result, condition, concession. Conditional Clauses, Relative Clause

Syntax II also provides knowledge on the Generative Syntax of Albanian.

Course Goals:

At the end of the course Syntax II the students are expected to be able to analyze simple texts like those given in this course. The students will also demonstrate their knowledge of the topics mentioned. During practical work (in seminars and exercises), it will be operated with scientific discussion and conversation, with analysis and synthesis, comparisons, and other inductive methods, to educate students in scientific research, and reaching conclusions independently.

Course Requirements: The continued assessments which contribute to course grading includes: Attendance and participation during seminar sessions (10 points); Partial evaluation (15 points); Written assignment or discussions (15 points).
