Course Title: Language through art

**Course Credits:** 5 ECTS

Language of Instruction: Albanian

## **Course Description:**

This course gives students knowledge about the structure of the discourse, which goes through four stages: - Invention (invencio) (heurésis from the Greek), the search by the speaker for all the arguments and other ways of persuasion, related to the topic of his discourse; - Disposition (disposition) (taxis from the Greek), the construction of the discourse, that is, the arrangement of all the arguments, from which the internal organization of the discourse, its plan, will flow; - Elocution (elokucio) (lexis from Greek), which is not related to the spoken word, but to the written compilation of the text, its language and style. It is precisely in this part that the famous figures of style are placed, some of which, in the 60s, transformed rhetoric into stylistics; - Action (action) (hypocrisis from the Greek), that is, the effective pronunciation of speech, including the effects of voice, mimicry, gestures. The discipline "Language through art" is very lively and diverse, just like life itself.

## **Course Goals:**

The course "Language through art" aims to acquaint students with the elements and principles of the language of art in general and the language of discourse in particular. The art of discourse, or otherwise called "the art of beautiful expression", has to do with the action of words in the mind. We will pay the greatest attention to literature - as the art of speech, seeing it: in relation to other arts; as a linguistic structure; as linguistic material in the face of the particularities of literary text and non-literary text; as an individual style with special features of the language, with different means of expression and stylistic values; that is, focusing not only on the text, but also on the subtextual meaning.

**Course Requirements**: The continued assessments which contribute to course grading include: Attendance and participation during seminar sessions (10 points); Coursework (30 points);
